Call for MAD Fall Show Director

MAD is seeking director/show package submissions for its 2017 Fall Show. Director candidates may submit any number of shows, with a suggested maximum of five shows. Each show submission will be treated as a separate submission, so each show package may include different proposed artistic and production staff, if desired. Please remember that the fall show is designed to be a large cast musical with a variety of opportunities in acting, music, and dance for a variety of MAD members.

Note: With the recent changes in the MAD bylaws, the production council (with input from the director) will decide on the number and schedule of performances (within the 4 weekends allowed by the rec-center schedule) as well as single casting or double casting any or all parts.

Your submission for each show should include the show name, any specifics about which version you would like to direct (if there is more than one version); the director's name and resume; any proposed staff for the show, including producer, choreographer, music and/or vocal director, technical director and any other identified staff. Note, the staff list is not required, but may be part of the submission if any of these positions are identified. Include a brief description of your vision for the show. The description should be 2 – 4 paragraphs and describe how you would make this show work for the MAD membership and audience.

Examples of things to include are a brief synopsis, show demographics, types of dance, flexibility in casting, general ideas on the set or technical issues, dealing with dated material, or other approaches that you think may be important to the show selection process.

MAD New Lifetime Member Category

As part of our recent Bylaws restructuring, MAD has created a new Membership category of Lifetime Member. The wording in the Bylaws is as follows:

The Executive Council may designate a person whom they deem to have provided long-term support to the group to be a lifetime member. They may participate as a Voting Member if they meet eligibility requirements of Article 3, Section 1; if not, they may participate as a Non-Voting Member without application.

The aim of this category is to acknowledge members who have given time and commitment to the club on a long-standing basis. For voting members, this would be an honorary designation. For those who are not voting members, the category grants permanent non-voting member status.

the townhouse across the way. After several "crying wolf" calls to the police, all to no avail, and a visit from a psychiatrist hired by her husband, Elaine may be on the verge of a breakdown. Should Elaine commit herself to a sanitarium for treatment? From this point on, the plot moves quickly and grippingly as those involved—Elaine's old friend and house guest Blanche; the inquisitive and rather sinister man who lives next door; and the nosy German maid Helga—all contribute to the deepening suspense and mystery of the play as it draws toward its riveting and chilling climax.

MAD mourns the loss of **Marty Davis** (3/1/39–2/20/17). He died in his sleep of complications of the fall he took last July. Marty (whose initials he proudly noted are MAD) joined MAD and made his debut as Tevye in MAD's 1981 production of *Fiddler on the Roof*. His subsequent onstage roles were few (*Camelot, Joseph...Dreamcoat*) but he loved his offstage contributions, such as producer, stage manager, sales manager, house manager, and MAD President. His funeral took place on February 22. Belle, together with Marty's siblings, are observing the mourning period (shiva) at his home through early Tuesday morning (except Friday night and Saturday).
