Public reading will be Saturday, March 27 at 8pm, viewable via YouTube.

MAD is forming a play-reading group, which will rehearse several times and then perform public readings of scripts. The goal of the group is to have fun participating.

The group will start with the play, “Sherlock Holmes – A Drama in Four Acts.” Casting for the play will be done through an online Google form with the possibility of online auditions if necessary. There will be two to three weekly rehearsals during March, leading up to the final public reading. All participation will be virtual over Zoom. Participation will count toward MAD non-voting member status. Notice: this play depicts cocaine use.

To participate, please fill in the form online, as soon as you can, but no later than Monday March 1. If you would like to participate in an offstage role and/or direct future play readings, you can indicate that on the form. The script is available from Kindle or Google Play for \$0.99; each participant will purchase their own electronic copy of “The Theatrical Sherlock Holmes”.

“Sherlock Holmes – A Drama in Four Acts,” was written by William Gillette with help from Sir Arthur Conan Doyle. It is an original story, not an adaptation. It was first produced in 1899 with Gillette playing Holmes; a role that he repeated many times over the next 35 years. Gillette’s use of a deerstalker cap and curved pipe in his depiction of Holmes have become enduring symbols of the character. In another important element of theatrical history, an early production featured a teen-aged Charlie Chaplin playing the pageboy Billy.
