Director's Notes

In my proposal to direct Mary Poppins, I wrote that my two goals for the show were to bring MAD back to its pre-pandemic levels of participation on stage and of audience sales. When I spoke to the cast at auditions, I added a third goal: to have fun.

MAD was hit hard by the pandemic, with the cancellation of our 2020 Spring show, A Day in Hollywood, A Night in Ukraine, and the transformation of our 2020 Fall Show, Merrily We Roll Along, into an online workshop. In 2021 and 2022, we soldiered on, putting on six Zoom-to-Youtube online play readings, from Sherlock Holmes to Around the World in 80 Days. We eased back into live theater last year with a smaller cast play, A Little Night Music; the success of that musical showed that it was now time to be more ambitious.

I am thrilled to say that Mary Poppins has met and exceeded all three goals. With 52 actors on stage (many in their first MAD show), and 90 people in the production, we have topped our recent pre-pandemic levels of participation. At the time I am writing this, ticket sales have just made Mary Poppins the best-selling MAD show in the last 10 years.

And we are having fun. It is the fun of working together – really hard work – to put together a joyful celebration of community.

I chose Mary Poppins because of the stage magic, the popularity of the show, and the family themes. And partly as a distraction. There are wars around the world, devastating hurricanes, and a highly contentious election. But Mary Poppins tells us that, "Anything Can Happen If You Let It", and Bert tells us that "troubles are never so bad when you look at them from a little higher up ... and there's plenty of folks ready to help you should you need 'em."

So, I welcome you, our audience, back to the post-pandemic MAD, and hope you have as much fun watching the show as we had putting it all together. As with every time I have directed, I am once again humbled and gratified by the collective energy and enthusiasm of the cast, the orchestra and the production team. We are thrilled that you are joining us.
